2023 State Advisory Board Meeting ALPHA GAMMA SIGMA, INC. STATE ADVISORY BOARD MEETING MINUTES April 29, 2023, at 10:00 a.m. Online Virtual Meeting



Special Rules for the Order of Business:

- 1. The agenda is fixed once a motion to accept, amend, add to, and/ or change an agenda has passed.

V. Additions/Deletions to the Agenda: No items were added or deleted to the agenda.

VI. Approval of the Agenda: The agenda was approved unanimously.

VII. Corrections to and Approval of the Minutes from Spring Advisory Board Meeting on October 8, 2022: The minutes were approved unanimously.

VIII. Corrections and Updates to the Fall Advisory Board Directory: None

IX. Unfinished Business: (Discussion and Action Items)

A. Board of Trustees Terms Ending, Vacancies and Appointments: Alannah Rosenberg of Saddleback College announced she is retiring from her position on the BOT. Regina Martinez of Mount San Antonio College stepped up to serve in her position and was unanimously accepted.

B. Follow up on increasing inter-chapter communication via a Shared Advisor Contact List and Shared Chapter Contact Web Site Page Update (SAB): Valerie asked if anyone wanted to speak concerning this issue. No one did.

C. Chapter Recruitment & Alpha Gamma Sigma Revitalization Workgroup

Update: (SAB): Kaycea Campbell pointed out that this agenda item was the same as agenda item E. So, the SAB moved on to the next item.

D. Student Trustee Support and Communication

Valerie told us there are no candidate(s) for student trustees for the 2023-24 school year. She and Student Trustee Tenecia Harris were working on this. The term of service for student trustees has been from spring semester to spring semester since the beginning of the Covid pandemic.

Tenecia talked about her positive experience working with and being mentored by Valerie. She found her presence at the board meetings a great learning process for her. Furthermore, she felt that communication had been difficult to recruit students from other chapters. She suggested adding a student nomination form to generate more interest for the next year. She did have some ideas she would leave with Valerie and would be presenting her workshop later this morning to drum up interest in the student trustee positions.

Kaycea thanked Tenecia for her work and was looking forward to her ideas. She wanted to know if we were having any election today or will it be pushed to the regional conference. Valerie wanted to gather interested members from Tenecia's workshop and mentor them.

John Quevedo added that it had long been a struggle to maintain strong student trustees and advisors are needed to support and mentor them.

Andrea Wang felt it should be the job of each chapter advisor to explain and talk about the position.

Valerie had been talking to other chapters. There was a suggestion that a student trustee could get service credit so that it would be something they could add to their portfolio.

Tenecia shared that she felt her position did not get the attention that it deserved, as it was not included with board member photos and the trustee position was not talked about during board elections.

Ashley suggested setting up a statewide Discord and asking students to join it as well as their own chapter Discord. David Powers was concerned with other nonmember students gaining access to the State Discord.

E. Advisors Handbook Updates:

i. Add language about Student Trustees

It was noted that no progress had been made; hence, there was no action at this time with the Advisors Handbook. Andrew committed to reviewing and working on the Advisors Handbook soon; Valerie and Joe expressed interest in working with him.

X. New Business: (Discussion and Action Items)

- A. Check Good Standing list to see if your chapter owes any funds and contact the Treasurer to settle. There are still a few outstanding Convention 2022 payments that may have slipped by: Marwin Luminarias of Fullerton College wanted to be sure that chapters were aware of the status of their state dues and asked that advisors email him if there were any questions. Kaycea announced she would be sending out bills for this convention soon.
- **B.** AGS as a non-profit and grant writing organization: As a point of information, Kaycea reminded everyone that we all have a lot of specialties and resources on our own campus—e.g., grant writers. AGS is a non-profit organization but there are ways available in terms of approaching other organizations for funding. She suggested partnering with these organizations if they were willing.

 Ashley recalled that Loyola Marymount University had sponsored over 10 years ago many scholarships for PTK. They might be interested in doing the same for AGS.
- C. Fullerton area for Hotel and AGS Centennial Convention in 2026: Kaycea & advisors at Fullerton College had started discussions about lodging and booking rooms. We are moving away from hotel contracts because of the high costs.

 Alannah wondered if AGS as an organization could book rooms at a hotel and use facilities at a member campus for the convention meetings and workshops. School vans could be used to shuttle student attendees to and from hotel(s) to campus.

Marwin added that most campuses have a campus credit card. You should see if your chapter has a relationship with the Bursar's Office.

Ashley wondered if individual chapters might pay for their own block of rooms but book under AGS. Andrew, however, felt there still needed to be a go between hotel & individual chapters.

Alannah wondered about Friday & Saturday night events—herding students & keeping them out of trouble.

D. AGS Convention Sacramento 2024: April 19-21 According to Kaycea, we will be going to Sacramento. If we do not go, we will forfeit the \$20,000 deposit at the Doubletree Hotel. Chapters must begin thinking about funding for transportation, etc. Andrew shared that Student Services on many campuses provide some part of conference funding dedicated to student advocacy. Appy through your Associated Students. Andrea also felt some colleges provide a portion of funding for such events; one just needs to ask.

Kathy Headtke of Alan Hancock College shared that many years ago, student officers at her school went to their President, Vice President, Rotary, and others and were able to secure funding for 75% of their conference.

E. Membership drive continuation to get inactive chapters back in the fold. Using Sacramento 2024 to get chapters really interested: Alannah said reaching out to other chapters had been difficult. Part of the problem was determining if there was anyone who had been in charge. She now has a list of those who had come back after doing an Advisor Teatime this semester. A permanent link to that Advisor Teatime meeting was needed.

Jennifer McBride reminded everyone that Randy Taylor created the letter that went out to college presidents and vice presidents asking if anyone at their college were interested in being an advisor and establishing a chapter. It was mentioned there is a need now to reach out with a phone call to those chapters struggling during the pandemic. Ashley related that Randy had passed on to her all his paperwork, but she had not yet found that letter.

Kathleen Patterson of Santa Ana College suggested using the setting of the convention in Sacramento to get chapters to rejoin AGS.

Jerry Ramos of Cerritos College were intrigued with reaching out to the Chancellor's Office. At a conference that he had attended at the College of the Canyons, members of the Chancellor's Office were present. He said he could reach out to a few people he met at that time.

F. AGS Jewelry Sales: Kaycea presented a form showing price increases of AGS jewelry. She stated that the form on the AGS website was not accurate. She will give the revised form to Sara Kelley to post on the AGS website. MOTION #1: Kaycea Campbell moved that jewelry prices be increased 15% across the board to be effective May 1, 2023; Joe Reyes seconded the motion. (MOTION #1 CARRIED.)

John shared that chapters could use part of their ICC allotment to spend on jewelry.

- G. 2023 Scholarship Allocations at Convention: MOTION #2: Kaycea Campbell moved that the SAB allow \$35,000 to be paid to 2023 scholarship recipients. Ashley McHale seconded the motion. (MOTION #2 CARRIED.)
- H. CD Purchase in 2023: MOTION #3: Kaycea Campbell moved that after dues collection on June 20, 2023, if a large balance remains in the operational account that upon the advice of our financial planner, another 6-month CD can be bought for increase to help with Convention payment. The amount will be based on what is required to pay operational bills at that time and what chapters pay as dues. Ashley McHale seconded the motion. (MOTION #3 CARRIED.)

Why is the bank balance so low? Why is the balance payment of future convention a negative number? The above questions are sure to be brought up by the SAB. It should be noted that AGS currently has a bank account to deal with operational expenses. Usually that bank balance is high and earns zero interest. With interest rates increasing dramatically with monetary policy – the approved \$80,000 CD purchase (earning 1.01% and \$664 interest) was rolled over to a one-year CD purchase to earn 4.70% after expiration before convention in February 2024 (earning approximately \$3,700 in interest). As such the bank account cash flow seems low, but the CD principal and interest of over \$84,000 will be available for convention in Sacramento come 2024.

2026 Centennial and Future Conventions

There was a discussion and decision when SAB last met that the current convention model with hotel contracts was not financially sustainable. Discussions surrounding hosting conventions on school campuses and/or allowing chapters to make decisions about hotel costs was also discussed. There are no contracts for hotels beyond 2025 for AGS. The 100th year celebration will be at Fullerton College. A cursory examination of hotels close to the college was done to get an idea of cost. What would SAB want AGS to do for hotels? Have a one-time, one-year contract from AGS, that chapters pay for based on registration? Or have a room block only with financial obligations linked to individual chatpers?

CDs and Operating Account

At FAM, the SAB approved a transfer to a CD earning 1.01%. The CD earned \$664 on the \$80,000 principal. Given that convention is virtual in 2023 and expenses being low, an opportunity to earn over 4% with a roll-over CD purchase was completed. This CD expires February 2024 and will earn approximately \$3,700 in interest. With the Convention in Sacramento being and with funds to pay for Convention and scholarships somewhat tenuous the decision was made to earn extra amounts as required to prepare financially for returning to in-person conventions.

Motion: I hereby move that after dues collection June 20, 2023, if a large balance remains in the operational account that with the advice of our financial planner, another 6-month CD can be bought for interest to help with Convention payment. The amount will be based on what is required to pay operational bills at that time and what chapters pay as dues.
